Advent Message of the Liturgical Year “B” of 2023/24

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I set my sights on Advent of Liturgical Year B, I am reminded of a story of Br Sizwe Mkhonza who was a fellow Franciscan, seminarian and student with me at St John Vianney Seminary in the nineties. He had gone out to teach catechism on Saturday in one of the city parish communities. After the instructions he decided to walk back to the seminary wearing his Franciscan habit. A young white student from the University of Pretoria stopped and offered him a lift to 179 Main Street. In their conversation Br Sizwe got to know that this young man actually had an appointment with his fiancé at the shopping mall in Brooklyn. So, he turned to him and said, “Sir, I am sorry that you will arrive late to your fiancé because you offered me a lift to the seminary here. I actually feel very bad about it.” This student from Tukkies responded confidently and said, “Look, brother she will understand. She also knows that I am worth waiting for!” I just find that extraordinary!



Advent is a special, meaningful, joyful, prayerful, vigilant, fulfilling, purposeful and fruitful Liturgical Season of renewing our faith in God who so loved the world that he gave us his Beloved Son, so that all of us may be saved within our humanity and receive life to the full. As we pray in the Angelus; “And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us!” This event of incarnation has changed the course of the history of humanity forever!

All the prophets throughout the history of humanity, the saints, the Holy Family of Nazareth: Mary and Joseph, Zachariah, Elizabeth, John the Baptist, the shepherds, the magi, the Holy Innocents, Simeon, Anna, the apostles and men and women of goodwill understood, knew with conviction and believed that Jesus Christ, the Messiah was worth waiting for, no matter how long it would have taken. In this period of Advent, we are summoned by the Church to deepen our prayer-life, recommit ourselves anew to love the Lord our God with all our hearts, with all our being, with all our strength, and with all our minds; and to love our neighbour as ourselves. If we desire to be holy and merciful like the heavenly Father, Jesus wants us to do more. He says, “Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you and pray for those who mistreat you” (Lk 6: 27-28).

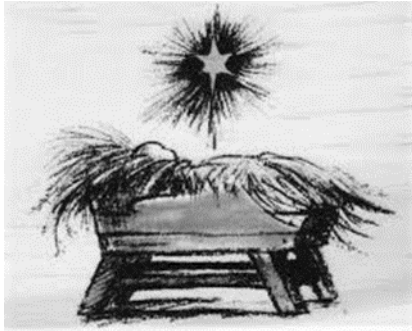
The message of love is important because we live in conditions of constant war, terrorist attacks, racial or religious persecution, and many other affronts to human dignity are judged differently, depending on how convenient it proves for certain, primarily economic interests. What is true as long as it is convenient for someone in power stops being true once it becomes inconvenient. These situations of violence, sad to say, have become so common as to constitute a real ‘third world war fought piecemeal’ (Fratelli Tutti,25).

This advent, our hearts, prayers and thoughts go to the people of Russia and Ukraine where war is raging on; they go to the Middle East where Jesus, the Prince of Peace was born. We pray for God’s mercies, for an end to hatred, racial discrimination, forced removals of local people, destruction of human life, infrastructure, the fabric of human society, the killing of innocent people, especially the most vulnerable: women, the elderly and children.

In this country we also have a fair share of our own challenges. Many South Africans are just tired of politics, and they have become despondent. In the words of Pope Francis, “Political life no longer has to do with healthy debates about long-term plans to improve people’s lives and advance the common good, but only with slick marketing techniques primarily aimed at discrediting others. In this craven exchange

Despondency is not a viable option. There is a wonderful opportunity to choose our destiny. I encourage all of us to rediscover our national dream, the excitement, hope and enthusiasm of our first democratic elections of April 1994; to make sure we are all registered, to go and vote next year, 2024. Let us take a moment of prayer, discernment, and reflection.

Guided by the Holy Spirit, informed by our faith, with a clear conscience and best intention in our minds, aware of the common good, the values of the Gospel, the values of our common humanity “ubuntu” (humanness), vote for the political party of your choice which you think is capable of taking us to a brighter future of human dignity, respect for all, equality, employment, justice, peace and care of the planet earth, our mother and common home.



Advent is the Holy Season of hope. Fr Flor McCarthy, SDB puts in more succinctly: “It is said that while there is life there is hope. This has an even deeper meaning in reverse:

while there is hope there is life! Hope is strength. Hope sheds light into despairing hearts. It inspires the will to live. It is the doctor’s most powerful ally. It is the shield against defeat and failure. It revives ideals and renews dreams. As long as there is hope, no situation is impossible. Advent summons us to wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. In the final analysis he is our hope”.

May the Birth of our Lord Jesus Christ bring abundant blessings to all our families, church communities, country and to the whole human family.

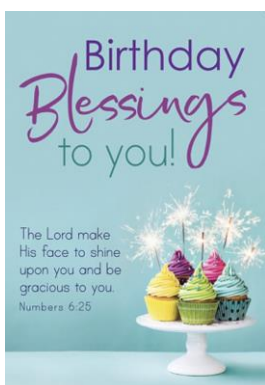

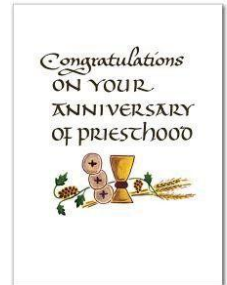

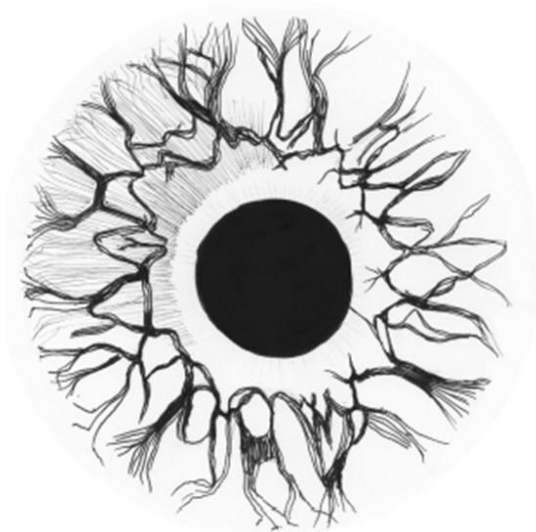
What is the Catholic synod 2022?

Since the reopening of St Luke's in June of 2022, we have had the pleasure of serving many groups and individuals that have stayed with us. Besides the clergy retreat of our own Diocese and the annual plenary, we have also had the pleasure of hosting clergy retreats from other Christian denominations and their service arms and even a conference of international missionaries. We respect the privacy of all our guests and hence will only mention the groups here of which it is well known that they have stayed with us, or which have given consent to have pictures published.

In July we were honoured to provide accommodation to the Girls' Choir of the Cologne Cathedral who also sang at Holy Mass at St Augustine's Cathedral that weekend. What a delight it was to hear their voices sing a hymn in St Luke's Chapel after the building had been closed during the pandemic and its future was uncertain. We have also posted a video of them singing in our Chapel on our Facebook page. A Boys' Choir from Germany is also scheduled to stay with us in late October while they are conducting a tour through South Africa and give concerts together with local choirs.

While it is most often groups that come and stay with us, we also offer accommodation to individuals. Some of them have been from religious orders who visit Gqeberha for appointments to receive visas for overseas travels, others are visiting family in town and sometimes they visit family members at Nazareth House next door. Some guests are just travelling through and are looking for a secure place in a quiet setting to spend the night. This year we could also offer a home to a priest and a religious sister who each spent their 3-month sabbatical with us.

The youth of our Diocese are especially important to us, and we have been delighted to host two confirmation groups with us this year. One of the groups was so happy that they are even looking for a date to come back soon. Email us for our special rates for youth groups which we offer to support the youth and to make St Luke's a place where they can grow closer to our Lord.

What can St Luke's Retreat Centre offer you and your parish?

St Luke's has 30 guest rooms which can accommodate up to 65 persons in rooms that sleep singles, doubles, 3 persons or 4 persons. Half of our rooms have ensuite bathrooms while the other rooms are close to shared bathrooms which offer privacy through shower stalls and changing areas. Additional to our Main Conference Hall which depending on the set up can seat up to 150 persons, we also have a board room on the 1st floor which can seat between 15 and 25 persons depending on setup. Our Chapel on the 1st floor is open 24 hours a day. We offer healthy and nutritious meals which are prepared in our own kitchen, and we will provide you with a menu before your stay with us.

Next year, St Luke's has the honour of hosting the 3-month Sabbatical programme of the South African Catholic Bishops Conference which be held from the 8th of April 2024 to the 27th of June 2024. During this time St Luke's will unfortunately be closed to any other groups so please plan your stay with us in 2024 in advance to work around these dates

A men's breakfast was held on Saturday 23rd September in our Parish Hall. Deacon Roland Dace was a guest speaker at this breakfast gathering.



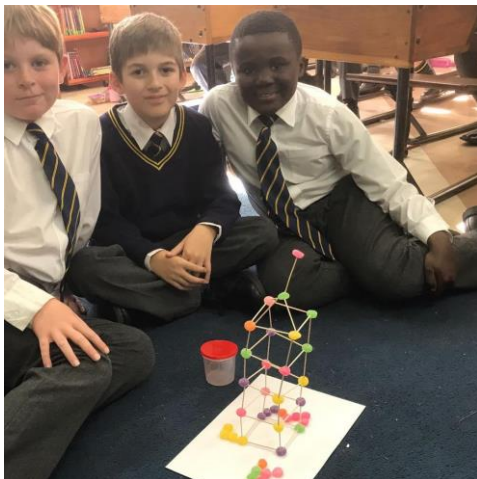
